

Summer Reading Requirements for incoming 1st graders

- Read a minimum of six books, choosing from various genres and authors. Similar level books and books from higher grade levels may be chosen by students with parent's approval.
- Students are to keep a record of books that are read during the summer. Forms are available at the main office. Each reading entry needs to be initialed by a parent. Forms are to be brought to the child's teacher the first week of school.

Please keep in mind that this book list is only a suggestion. Students may substitute books which are not on the list, or choose from books on an upper grade level's list.

Books should be read independently by the student.

Reading is such an important part of life. With it we can learn God's truth in His Word. We can also explore the world without ever leaving the house.
