1. Read the required 8th grade book, *A Wrinkle in Time* by Madeleine L'Engle This book will be discussed in the fall.
2. ***In addition to the required book*** read **one book of your choice**. Complete reading it by the first day of school. The Summer Reading List for 8th Grade provides numerous recommended titles. The recommended reading list will be attached to this letter. Complete the written assignment for *A Wrinkle in Time* only.
3. Complete the contract indicating that you read the required book and one other selection. ***Both student and parent must sign the contract.*** By signing the contract, parents are approving their child's selection for the books of their choice.
4. **Turn in the contract and the written assignment on the first day of school.** The written assignment will be graded for neatness and accuracy. **There will be a 10% grade reduction in the grade for each day the assignment is late.**

Book Reporting: 8th Grade Summer Writing Assignment

*These alternative assignments to the standard "book report" can be used for reporting on your book. Choose **one of the activities** to complete for your book. In addition, you must also complete the attached Book-Info Chart and character illustration as part of your assignment. Fasten all papers together and turn them all in with your name on the first day of school.*

- 1. Write a two-page biography of a character from the story. Use any and all information given by the author throughout the book. Write the facts about the character in chronological order, even if they weren't presented that way during the story. Be sure to present the character using proper grammar and punctuation. Biographies MUST be typed (Times New Roman, Font 12, Double-Spaced).**
- 2. Write a two-page summary of the story. Be sure to include the main characters, setting, plot, climax, and resolution, but be brief and to the point. Put the title and author's name at the top of the page and put your name at the bottom. Be sure to present the story using proper grammar and punctuation. Summaries MUST be typed (Times New Roman, Font 12, Double-Spaced).**
- 3. Write a two-page essay about the book's theme/moral. *What did you think the author was trying to say through his novel?* Give three different examples that illustrate the moral/theme of the story you have chosen and discuss the significance of each example to the author's story. Your essay should be 5 paragraphs total. Be sure to present the essay using proper grammar and punctuation. Essays MUST be typed (Times New Roman, Font 12, Double-Spaced).**
